

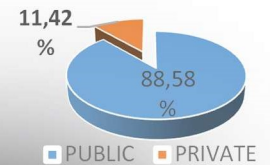
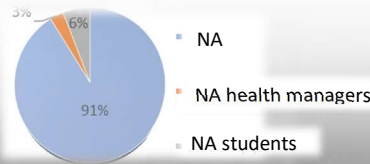
Involvement, commitment and contributions of the Nurse Anaesthetists (NA) within the French hospital system confronted with the COVID epidemic-19

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In the context of the CoVid-19 pandemic, the National Union of Nurse Anaesthetists (SNIA) asked nurses-anesthetists on their involvement and their activities during the epidemic related to the SARS - Cov2 Pathogen Agent. We explored the different fields of NA exercise (Emergency and Intensive Care Units, operating theatres ...) as well as the changes of the work

Method: Online questionnaire distributed on our professional networks. Relayed by our partners for 13 days. Questionnaire opened from the 21st of April 2020 until the 4th of May 2020

Results :
Of the 1984 answers, 1576 were valid or almost 15% of the working population



Personal Protective Equipment

67.13% declare to have suffered constraints related to the lack of personal protective equipment (PPE).

Working hours :

85.6% had to adapt to a new schedule of exercise.

60.98% worked overtime.

47.46% worked weeks longer than 48 hours.

Time off

54.38% had their vacations cancelled.

Drafting of specific procedures

33.69% of the NA participated in the creation/writing of specific procedures; this proportion rises to **68.18%** for NA health managers.

Training of health professionals :

62.94% of the NA participated in the training of health workers, **88.64%** for the IADE Health Managers

Creation of intensive care units

70.69% have organized the setting up of resuscitation units.

Roll-out of Intensive Care Units :

72.3% of the NA are employed in resuscitation units,
