Introduction

- World Health Organization (WHO) officially announced Covid-19 as a global pandemic in early March 2020.
- Our target: the risk perception of Healthcare Professionals (HCPs) involved in the treatment of Covid-19 cases in Cyprus
- Importance of Cyprus: it's geographical point acts as a hub connecting the very end
 of South-eastern Europe to the Middle East and Africa; this can be critical for the
 spread of the virus both in the country as well as outside it



















Methodology

- An online survey was conducted from mid-March to mid-May 2020
- A new tool (questionnaire) was developed, and delivered to frontline medical staff, in both the private and the public sector
- Our tool was validated by two experts, medical professionals and academic researchers in the fields of healthcare management and health and safety
- Questionnaire was initially introduced to a focus group of 8 HCPs with minor adjustments to follow





















Results

- ✓ **116 responses** from HCPs
- ✓ Their level of knowledge regarding Covid-19 was Neutral to Positive.
- ✓ As International Knowledge on the "fight" against Covid-19 positive cases was increasing > Positive impact on the perception of risk of the medical stuff
- ✓ As knowledge was growing on the symptoms & severity of the cases globally, CY HCPs were able to estimate the expected cases to rise based on the EU Health Status of the country's population
- ✓ <u>Common belief:</u> personal protective equipment (PPE) is the way to increase both occupational health and safety and patient safety
- ✓ <u>Risk Communication & Awareness</u> were critical to prevent the spread of the virus within the country (i.e. self-isolation, post-travel quarantine etc.)

















Conclusions



- Unprecedented and quite Challenging times both for the communities, but also for the daily practice that put all HCPs in direct danger
- WHO several guidelines & provided online courses and training sessions free of charge to all HCPs and allied healthcare professionals around the world raise their awareness and preparedness regarding prevention and control of the virus
- The Pandemic kicked in way before relevant information was available from WHO and other national and international Public Health sources
- As a result, the Risk perceptions of frontline HCPs varies substantially amongst different countries around the world
- Cyprus showed great reflexes under the circumstances and hopefully will keep doing so now that the 2nd wave of Covid-19 is knocking on our doors
