



The Pediatric Orthopedics workforce in Romania and its impact on clubfoot patients' access to healthcare services

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Introduction

- Health systems need to have enough Pediatric Orthopedists, who are adequately qualified and trained, in order to ensure clubfoot patients' proper access to the needed care.
- The Romanian healthcare system
 has been long experiencing
 shortages of properly trained
 pediatric orthopedics surgeons.

Results

- Between 2009 and 2019, the number of specialists in Pediatric
 Orthopedics fluctuated noticeably, with a decrease of 59%.
- Only 4% of all the orthopedic surgeons in Romania are currently orthopedic pediatric surgeons.
- The Ponseti method is underapproached in Romania.

Methods

- Secondary data available in the Activity of the Healthcare Institutions (Activitatea Unităților Sanitare) was analyzed.
- Second, a qualitative approach
 was adopted targeting parents of
 children diagnosed with clubfoot
 across Romania.

Discussions

- Policy options should focus on raising awareness around clubfoot.
- The guidelines which emphasize the recommended treatment of musculoskeletal disorders should represent a standpoint for specialists and future specialists.
